on Captain Merrill. I was a young fireman in R division working in the Carpenter Shop when Captain Merrill took command of the "San Ju Ni Maru", as we affectionately called the old "War Horse", and I'll never forget the first day I met the Captain in person.

If you'll, remember the Carpenter shop was on the O-2 deck, amidships above the cargo hold. When anyone came to the Carpenter Shop we could hear them coming up the ladder. One day, as was usually the case, Jim Morlan our First Class PO was kicked back with his feet on the bench and having his morning coffee (second pot) and the ship fitters were busy with the latest issues of Playboy. I was working on a Cumshaw project for a guy in the Bakery, (he kept us in fresh pastries) when we heard footsteps coming up the ladder. I walked over and opened the hatch. As I stepped out to see who was coming, I came face to face with Captain Merrill. I snapped to attention and yelled out, "attention on deck"! Behind me I could hear the rustle of magazines being stuffed into the Welding Rod Locker and the sound of Morlan and his coffee cup crashing to the deck. In the time it took Captain Merrill to returned my salute and ascended the last 2 steps of the ladder, Morlan was back on his feet and every thing was put away except my Cumshaw project.

Morlan asked the Captain how we could be of service and he replied that he had come to see me. The Captain asked me what I was working on and my heart sunk. I had visions of Brig time and how I would explain to the folks at home why I had been kicked out of the Navy for doing unauthorized work. He told everyone else to "carry on", at which point everyone suddenly had work to do somewhere else on the ship. He looked carefully at all the pieces that were laid out on the bench and asked how they went together but never asked what the project was for. Instead he said he had been reviewing my file and had noticed that I was a Designated Striker to the Patternmaker Rate and wondered if I could build him a set of "Hat Stretchers". I told him I could.

I grabbed a set of calipers and a ruler, proceeded to the Captains cabin and began to measure his head! I was so nervous that I'm surprised I was able to do it at all. Within a couple of days I had made and exact three-dimensional cross section model of his head, including the bump on his forehead.

Captain Merrill lives only a few miles from me in Redmond Washington and while we have not met again in person, I have spoken to him on the phone. He tells me that he still has that hat stretcher sitting on his mantel.


