Comments from the Secretary:

With new mailing regulations, we have gone to a slightly different mailing format to save costs. This newsletter is being mailed in late spring rather than in January because of changes made for the 2014 Reunion. At the business meeting of the 2013 Reunion, Hoyt asked to step down from office because of family health issues. 

Dave compiled the history and laboriously typed each page on his typewriter, then had it photocopied and bound in 1986 as a 48-page booklet. It was sold at cost to cover printing, but we have no more printed copies available. Thanks to Chris's USS Calvert web site, persons can download and print copies of this entire booklet at no cost.

Back issues of the *Calversion*, official newsletter of the USS Calvert, are also available on this web site. John Cole began publishing the *Calversion* in the late 1970s. Chris Funck has included copies of the newsletter on the web site dating from 1982 to present. Lost your copy of the *Calversion*, now you can find it on the web.




