Comments from the Secretary:

We were saddened to learn of the death of Lou Christiansen, Commander, on January 4, 2015. Lou had been elected as Commander of the U.S.S. Associates at the Des Moines Reunion in October, 2013, and he had been making plans for a reunion in 2016 to commemorate the 50th anniversary of the decommissioning of the U.S.S. Calvert. Lou served on the U.S.S. Calvert during the Vietnam era and was active in veterans' activities. In late 2013, Lou was diagnosed with brain cancer, followed with surgery and treatment in the subsequent months. We extend our sympathy to Lou's wife, Carol, and his daughter, Karina, and the U.S.S. Calvert Associates sent a small memorial to Drug Crisis in Our Backyard, an organization formed by Lou and his wife to raise awareness about drugs. His obituary appears on p. 2.

Obituary - Louis H. Christian, Jr.

SOMERS, N.Y. – Louis Hammershaimb Christiansen, Jr., a Somers resident, died on Sunday. He was 68.

Christiansen Jr. was a Vietnam veteran, a retired NYC police officer assigned to the Bronx Task Force an elite squad of 100 men, a contractor and a Somers Lion.

He co-founded Drug Crisis in Our Backyard, along with his wife Carol, to raise awareness of the dangers of drug abuse.

He was a beloved member of the community serving people through many organizations. Christiansen Jr. was a music lover, an avid trivia buff and New York Mets fan.

He is survived by his wife Carol, daughter Karina and predeceased son Erik, who was a NYC police detective.

Calling hours will be held at Clark Funeral Home in Yorktown Heights on Wednesday, Jan. 7 from 2 p.m. to 4 p.m. and 7 p.m. to 9 p.m. A mass of Christian burial will be held at St. Patrick's Church in Yorktown on Thursday, Jan. 8 at 10 a.m. Interment will follow at St. Michael's Cemetery in East Elmhurst.

2015 USS Calvert Reunion Planned for Baltimore, Maryland (Oct. 1-3, 2015)

Chris Funck, webmaster of the USS Calvert website, and grandson of Sterling Funck who served on the U.S.S. Calvert (1942-1944), offered to host the 2015 USS Calvert reunion in Baltimore area. Those in attendance voted unanimously to accept the generous offer of Chris and Tricia Funck to host the 2015. Chris and Tricia have made arrangements for the reunion to be held at Baltimore at the Hilton Garden Inn, Baltimore/Arundel Mills, Maryland:

Hotel. The hotel rate of \$129 plus tax is in effect the night of September 30, Wednesday (check in time: 4:00 PM) through the October 4, Sunday (check out time: 12:00 PM). The cut off date for this rate of \$129 is 8/30/2015 with 2 Queen Beds or 1 King Bed. Rooms include mini-refrigerator, microwave, coffeemaker, and other amenities. (A hotel registration form will appear in the June newsletter.)

Airport. The hotel is near the Baltimore/Washington International Airport (BWI), and a free shuttle is included with the cost of the room from the airport to the hotel. Also the shuttle will transport free within a 5-mile radius which includes Arundel Mall, Maryland Live Casino, and restaurants.

Schedule. The schedule with final times and costs for tours and meal arrangements are still being planned and subject to change. (A registration form with the final schedule and costs for tours and meals will be in the June newsletter.) Below is the tentative schedule:






