*(GM Note: John Yamnicky served on the USS Calvert as Gunnery Officer from June 1952 to Nov., 1953. After his duty on the Calvert, he then went to Navy flight school, graduating as a Naval Aviator. He flew combat missions in the Korean and Vietnam era. He died on American Airlines Flight 77 when terrorists used the plane to t hit the pentagon on Sept. 11, 2001.)

Reunions Over The Years

Thirty-six years ago, the first USS Calvert reunion was held in 1979 at Rochester, Minnesota, with John and Lila Cole as hosts. At that first reunion, the USS Calvert Associates was organized with John Cole elected as Commander of the USS Calvert Associates and Hoyt Worthington as Vice Commander. The next reunion was held in Atlanta, Georgia with Hoyt and Sara Worthington as hosts.

For the next 20 years, national reunions were held every two years with regional mini-reunions sometimes held in between. In 1999, the USS Calvert Associates voted to hold national reunions every year. In 2001, Bud and Barb Ruth were hosting the reunion in Orlando, FL which was cancelled because of 9-11 events. A few 2001 registrants had already arrived at the hotel in Orlando, so some USS Calvert people remember the reunion of 2001.
