

Note from the Commander:

I'm sure everyone is tired of this winter weather. I know I am as we had at least 20 inches of snow and ice on the ground in January and were getting 3 to 8 inches of snow about every other day with temperatures in the 20s and below. I hope everyone is handling it well. I've got a cure for those winter blues. Shirley and I have been working all winter on the 2017 USS Calvert reunion in Portland, Oregon, October 3 through 7. It will be held at the Monarch Hotel, just south of Portland in Clackamas, OR. The room rate is \$119 per night, in very nice rooms. Everyone must make their own reservations. Deadline for reservations is September 12, 2017, and must mention USS Calvert Reunion to receive the space rate in the hotel. There is a real nice restaurant (Sam's) serving breakfast, lunch, and dinner, or there are restaurants (Spaghetti Factory and others) very close and within walking distance. The hotel is very easy to get to by air, train, or auto. More information with direction and location as well as tour registration will be in the June newsletter.

We have a fun filled three days planned with tours, etc. Starting with Tuesday, Oct. 3, will be registration and meet/greet in the hospitality room. Dinner on your own.

Wednesday, Oct. 4, we will have coffee and toast/English muffins at the hotel as we will board a bus that will take us to Cascade Locks where we embark onto Stern Wheel Paddle boat and head up the Columbia River through the Cascade Locks. We will be served breakfast and lunch aboard. The trip is about 5 hours long. Returning to Cascade Locks to board the bus back to the hotel. Dinner on your own and hospitality room open.

On Thursday, Oct. 5, again we will board a bus and proceed to the Evergreen Aviation Museum, home of the famous Howard Hughes "Spruce Goose," where you can have pictures taken sitting in the pilot's seat wearing Howard Hughes' hat for the cost of \$25 with your wife in the co-pilot's seat! The museum has airplanes from before Wright Bros. to space capsules. From couple hours there we board the bus and go to Depot Bay, a quaint little town on the ocean. We will then go to the Sea Hag Bar and Grill where the commander will treat you to lunch. The bartender will entertain you with a song or two, playing the bottles on the back bar. After we do a little shopping and whale watching, we will board the bus back to the hotel. Dinner on your own and hospitality room open.

Friday, Oct. 6, we will again board and proceed to Hood River, Oregon, along the Columbia River and take the train through the vineyards and orchards to Mt. Hood. Gone from my sight and that is all. She is just as large in hull as she was when she was at my side and just as able to bear her load of freight to her destined port.



News About The 2016 USS Calvert Reunion Cruise

The 2016 USS Calvert/USS Harry Lee Reunion was a cruise held October 3-7, 2016, departing out of the Port of Miami on the Royal Caribbean ship, "Enchantment of Seas." Dale Willhite served as the host by coordinating the USS Calvert reunion with the cruise ship, and we are grateful for all the work he and Pat Snyder did in making a memorable time for all attending the 2016 USS Calvert.

Originally planned as a Bahamas cruise, the cruise was diverted because of Hurricane Matthew from its original destination stops in the Bahamas and Key West, Florida and instead headed west with one stop at Cozumel, Mexico. The cruise pretty much avoided severe winds or choppy waves. For the most part, cruise participants enjoyed sunny and mild weather. When returning to Florida, the cruise was detained an additional six hours because the Port of Miami had not been cleared for entering ships. Several persons planning to leave Miami on Florida were delayed one or two days as the Miami Airport was shut down on Friday with all Friday departures rescheduled for Sat. or Sun.

Thirty-four people were on board for the 2017 USS Calvert Reunion cruise. The senior member of the USS Calvert Reunion was Wm. Habrat (1942-1951), who was joined on the cruise by several members of his family. The youngest attendees were Juliana Bariteau (8) and Rosemaree Bariteau (6), granddaughters of Richard Morse (1951-1954), accompanying their mother, Kathleen Morse Bariteau, and grandmother, Glynna Morse. More and more, relatives and friends of USS Calvert/USS Harry Lee veterans are attending the reunions—and we are happy to have them attend the reunions.

The USS Calvert group had access to a hospitality meeting room each day used for business meetings and reminiscing with old buddies; and on the last night, a Memorial Ceremony was held honoring 38 sailors. The USS Calvert group sat at the same tables each evening for dinner, and breakfast and lunch were open to whichever dining hall one wished to utilize. 



The Calvert Maritime Museum



More than 30 years ago, John Cole, founder and first Commander of the USS Calvert Associates, began sending USS Calvert memorabilia, newsletters, and information to the Calvert Maritime Museum in Solomons, Maryland. John foresaw there was a need for a permanent depository for some of the items

that USS Calvert veterans had sent him through the years. The 2015 USS Calvert Reunion toured the Calvert Museum housed in a beautiful coastal site not far from Sparrow Point where early naval amphibious assault training was conducted during World War II, including some USS Calvert and USS Harry Lee veterans..

Very few ships have a permanent display in any museum, and we are grateful to have a permanent site where the USS Calvert APA 32 display will be available for our children, grandchildren, and descendants in the years long after we are gone. If you are near the East Coast in the future, plan to visit the Calvert Maritime Museum; it is well worth your time—and there are some great eating and recreational opportunities nearby!
