## Clarence Hoyt Worthington April 26, 1926 - February 25, 2019

USS Calvert Associates people were saddened to learn of the passing of Hoyt Worthington in February. Hoyt served on the USS Calvert during World War II (1944-1946) as a Gunners Mate. Hoyt attended the first USS Calvert Reunion held in Rochester, MN in 1979 and was elected to the position of Executive Officer (VP) of the newly formed USS Calvert Associates. Hoyt and his wife, Sara, also were the photographers for that 1979 reunion as well as the USS Calvert reunions for several decades, taking hundreds of group and individual photos. The second USS Calvert Reunion held in Atlanta, GA in 1981 was hosted by Hoyt and Sara. Hoyt served as the Executive Officer from 1979 through 2013 and was the Acting Commander after the death of John Cole in 2013. Because of health considerations, he declined to continue in an officer capacity after 2013; however, he continued to attend most of the reunions in the following years. Hoyt and his grandson, Robert Alred, attended the 2018 reunion in Springfield last September. Below is the obituary for Hoyt:

#### **Obituary of Hoyt Worthington**

Mr. Clarence Hoyt Worthington, age 92, of Cedartown, passed away on Monday, February 25th, 2019. He was born on April 26, 1926 in Cedartown, Georgia. He was the son of the late Dee and Winnie Upchurch Worthington.

Mr. Hoyt Worthington was a veteran of the United States Navy. He was an active member of First Baptist Church, Cedartown since 1956 and was a member of the L.D. Wheeler Sunday School Class. He was also Mason of the Caledonia Lodge # 121, Yarab Shriner, and a member of the American Legion Brewster-Cleveland Post #186.

Mr. Worthington is survived by his sons, Dennis Worthington (Marie) and Steve Worthington; and sister, Betty Moore; Grandchildren; Robert Alred (Carla), Jason Alred, Mandie Fossett (David), Morgan Worthington (Jannell), and Mitchell Worthington, (Megan). Mr. Worthington was preceded in death by his parents; wife, Mrs. Sara Worthington; daughter, Kathy Alred; and brother, William Lester Barnwell.

Wayne Benefield officiating. ## 2018 USS Calvert Reunion Held in Springfield/Branson

Forty-three people attended the 2018 USS Calvert/USS Harry Lee Reunion held in Springfield, Missouri on September 26 through 30. Glynna Morse was the host of the 2018 reunion.

Thursday, the group headed to Branson to tour the Shepherd of Hills Homestead including Uncle Matt's cabin and grounds where Harold Bell Wright based his famous book, *Shepherd of the Hill*. Lunch was held on the paddle wheeler, the *Branson Belle*, followed by a luncheon show and cruise on Table Rock Lake. After departing from the paddlewheeler, the bus went to the American Bandstand Legends in Concert show. Upon arriving back at the hotel, the group then had a deli buffet dinner.

Friday the reunion attendees boarded the bus to Seymour, MO where they saw Amish homes and countryside on our way to Uncle Rooster's Restaurant for lunch. Next, the group toured the Laura Ingalls Wilder Museum, Mansfield, MO, as well as Rocky Ridge Farm and homestead where Laura and Almanzo Wilder lived for six decades, the home where Laura wrote her *Little House on the Prairie* books. From the Rocky Ridge Farm, the bus then headed a few miles from Mansfield to Baker Creek Heirloom Seeds Pioneer Village, the site of Ozark pioneer buildings, gardens, etc.

Saturday, the bus took passengers to the History Museum on the Square in Springfield which featured a large exhibit of U.S. Route 66 memorabilia. Next, the bus went to Wonders of Wildlife exhibit, followed by lunch at Lambert's Café, Ozark, MO, home of famous "throwed rolls" and extra helpings of food!

## The USS Calvert and USS Harry Lee Connection

USS Calvert men serving in the World War II era will frequently mention the USS Harry Lee. Here is how the USS Harry Lee came to be associated with the USS Calvert as written in *History of USS Calvert*, by Dave Cullen, Jr. (1986) in which the Task Group Commander, Admiral Lyal A. Davidson, USN, commented on the Calvert's action in the North African Campaign:

"On the morning of 22 October 1942, while exercising off Cove Point Light in the Chesapeake, the USS Harry Lee, combat-loaded and prepared to leave in Operation Torch (to South Africa), suffered a machinery derangement which necessitated the transfer of the embarked troops and the entire cargo to the USS Calvert, a

newly-commissioned vessel, undergoing organization, untrained and untried in amphibious operations. Captain J. W. Whitfield, USN, with 23 of his officers and the crews of his landing craft exchanged ships and combat equipment, combat-loaded the USS Calvert, and sailed from base HYBO to join the overseas expedition on 25 October 1942. So well and efficiently was the transfer accomplished that upon arrival off SAFI, FRENCH MOROCCO on the morning of 8 November 1942, the ship-to-shore movement from the USS Calvert in coordination with the USS Harris and the subsequent unloading of the transport was carried out with expedition and timeliness to the end that the USS Calvert made her full contribution to the success of our aims in Operation Torch. Captain J. W. Whitfield, USN, commanded first the USS Harry Lee, then the USS Calvert, and the officers and men under his command in the USS Calvert are commended to the Task Force Commander for special recognition of the meritorious performance of an arduous, exacting and dangerous task."

The landing at SAFI was a comparatively easy one as resistance from the enemy was light. On the afternoon of 14 November, the USS Calvert and other ships had completed the off-loading, and they departed for Norfolk, Virginia, arriving on 24 November, where minor repairs were begun and additional training commenced. According to accounts from crew members on the tour to North Africa, some of the former USS Harry Lee crew remained to serve on the USS Calvert, while others returned back to the USS Harry Lee for the remainder of their service during World War II.

## 40<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of First USS Calvert Reunion Held in 1979

The first USS Calvert Reunion was hosted in Rochester, MN, on July 20-22, 1979 by John Cole and wife, Lila; daughters, Lyn, Wendy, & Sherry; and son, Dean. John Cole had started a newsletter in 1978 which he had compiled from addresses sent to him by friends and through advertisements in American Legion and VFW magazines, and he planned the first reunion in 1979. Seventy-two persons attended this first reunion. At the 1979 Reunion, the USS Calvert Associates was organized. John Cole was elected as Commander, Hoyt Worthington, Executive Officer, with Richard Morse as Yeoman (Secretary). In the beginning, reunions were held every two years until 1995 when the group voted to hold reunions annually.
