#### Commander's Comments:





# Edward 'Bud' Ruth Past Storekeeper, USS Calvert Associates

USS Calvert shipmates were saddened to learn of the passing of Edward 'Bud' Ruth on February 8, 2022. Bud Ruth served as a Storekeeper on the USS Calvert in 1953-1955 during the Korean War. He was the longp-time Storekeeper for the USS Calvert Associates, helping us obtain USS Calvert memorabilia (caps, t-shirts, patches, etc.) which were available for sale at reunions and on the CALVERSION newsletter.

Bud & Barbara were the hosts of the Sept. 13-15, 2001 Calvert Reunion in Orlando, the reunion which was cancelled because of 9-11. Actually, there was a reunion of USS Calvert people who had arrived

early before transportation was called to a halt because of the 9-11 restrictions. Bud & Barbara stayed in contact with those people already at the hotel until transportation gradually resumed.

Glynna Morse had a good conversation with Bud Ruth during the summer of 2021 when he called to tell her that he and Barbara had changed their address from their long-time home to be nearer their son and daughter in Lakeland, FL. Below are excerpts from his obituary.

#### Obituary of Edward 'Bud' Ruth (1931-2022)

Edward Howard Ruth, age 90 passed away Saturday, January 8, 2022, in Lakeland, Florida. Born in Taylorville, Illinois on Aug. 7, 1931, to the late Alex S. & K. Gertrude Ruth, his family relocated to Florida in the mid 1940's. He graduated from Fort Myers High School. After his service in the U S Navy he started employment with Publix Super Markets where he retired as V.P. Human Resources after 46 years.

He is survived by Spouse - Barbara Jene (Mosley) Ruth, Son - Rick (Dawn) Ruth of Lakeland, Florida, Daughter - Sherri Ruth of Lakeland, Florida, Sisters - Doris Wollam of Austin Texas and Trudy Baker of Naples, Florida. He is preceded in Death by Son Michael D. Ruth and Sister Jean Garlin.

# Service Available to Convert USS Calvert-Related Photo Negatives, Slides, and 8mm Film Footage to Digital Form

Do you have some old USS Calvert negatives, slides, or film sitting in a box? Chris Funck, Web Master for the USS Calvert web site, is offering to digitize and return your USS Calvert related photo negatives, slides, and 8mm film footage. The USS Calvert Associates has paid for scanning equipment for Chris to use. If the photos, etc. are related to the USS Calvert, there will be no charge for the digitizing, and Chris will return the original materials and a copy of digital files to you. Chris has on the web site a collection of digitized slides (1950-1954) provided from the son of Robert Hile taken 1950-1954.

#### Here is how it works:

- 1. Contact Chris via phone at (484) 354-7323 to discuss the details of your collection or for any questions you might have.
- 2. Ship your slides or film to him. He will provide his mailing address during your phone call
- 3. Chris will digitize them and then send them back to you the original materials and a DVD containing the digital replicas.
- 4. Chris will seek your permission before adding any photographic materials onto the USS Calvert web site and before sending digital copies to the Calvert Marine Museum for addition to their USS Calvert collection.

### On the Lighter Side -- USS Calvert News - October, 1964

Chris Funck, USSCalvert.Com webmaster, sent this news item from the *San Diego Union*, Oct. 27, 1964, and Chris thought some of the readers of this newsletter will remember the incident, possibly the strategic work of some *USS Calvert* shipmates?

The newspaper stated, "Cows Back in Pasture." "Two life-size fiberglass cows missing from the Admiral Kid Officers Club at the Naval Training Center (*the USS Calvert*) were back in their 'pasture' at Alpine yesterday. "

"Jack Austin, the club manager, who reported the cows missing Friday, said yesterday the pair of cows, worth \$650, were mysteriously returned to the base over the weekend."

"Who took the cows and who returned them, he said, is anybody's guess."

"The hollow lightweight animals had been rented from a company in Alpine and used in a cheese festival display."
